### **Defining Characteristics of 1%**

- Increasingly: bankers, bosses and big oil

- "Smarter" than the 99% (as measured by educational attainment)

- They're just like you and me ("earners")



### **Getting to Know the 1%**

- What makes them different?
- Fascinating industrial/occupational analysis
- No 2011 Census reference
- Data implications:
- Restoration of mandatory long-form census questionnaire
- Additional questions on tax form
- Bigger sample size in SLID (new replacement)




### Top 1%: Smarter than most?

- Higher educational attainment as a cohort
- In 2006, 60% with minimum Bachelor's degree (was 40% in 1981 – 50% increase)
- Overall, 20% in 2006 (10% in 1981)
- "All earners" doubled educational attainment, most of growth in income at top




### Work Harder, Deserve More?





## More Canadians with university degrees but their employment rate is falling






### **Policy Implications**

- Better educated, to stay in same place or lose ground
- Kruger: If you don't think education is the solution, try ignorance
- Working longer: time limited proposition
- If not more income then more supports?
- Child care, transit, post-secondary affordability




# Earned Incomes – Falling Share of Top 1% Incomes since mid 2000s

### **Policy Implications**

#### TAX POLICY - Don't make things worse

- Freeze/roll back RRSP contribution limits
- Don't expand TFSA contribution limits
- No income splitting for <65</li>
- BARGAINING POWER Stop coddling the powerful
- Don't disrupt collective bargaining
- Limit use of Temporary Foreign Workers
